Pediatric Diabetes Epidemic

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program is designed for registered nurses working with pediatric clients in various settings and for any registered nurses who desire to update their knowledge of pediatric diabetes. The information is also appropriate for other healthcare professionals such as MSW, RD, and therapists.

GOAL OF THE PROGRAM

To enable the learner to advocate for interventions to prevent the development of diabetes in the pediatric population and to more effectively assist in the management of care of those who are diagnosed with diabetes.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this program the participant will be able to:

- 1. Recognize the early signs and symptoms which may indicate a diagnosis of Type 1 Diabetes.
- 2. Identify the different types of insulin, their mechanism of action, and duration of action.
- 3. Understand how "play" can be used to help children cope with diabetes.
- Understand the challenges and opportunities nutrition plays in prevention and management of the diabetic child.
- Discuss the role of the school nurse and challenges the school nurse faces in the management of pediatric diabetes.
- 6. List two (2) resources for families and practitioners for pediatric diabetes management.
- 7. Plan a program of exercise for pediatric diabetic management.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Diabetes in children is reaching epidemic numbers. The battle to turn the tide is a difficult and multidisciplinary one. For the purpose of prevention and management of those already diagnosed, we will explore diet, lifestyle, and medication management.

Dietitians, school nurses, a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner, exercise experts, and a Child Life Specialist will discuss what we need to do to change the predictions of even greater numbers of children with diabetes and include the latest interventions for managing diabetes in children.


