AUGUST 23, 2013 - Are You Safe in Your Workplace?

Workplace violence, bullying, harassment, and unsafe conditions should be a foreign concept for healthcare workers but the literature has exposed unsafe work environments and practices. Experts in workplace and personal safety will shed light on issues which are unsafe, provide ways to increase our awareness, and empower employees to work toward safer environments.

SEPTEMBER 27, 2013 - People Can and Do Recover: Rethinking Mental Illness

This program brings new thinking about the treatment and outcomes for mental illness. Dr. Danial Fisher, an internationally recognized psychiatrist, will present the change from the Biologically-Based Model to one based on the recognition that recovery comes from empowerment, self-determination, and meaningful connections with others. Watch for the brochure detailing this program.

OCTOBER 18, 2013 - Pharmacology Update

Designer drugs, pharmaceuticals found in the home which may be abused, the latest asthma and allergy medications for children, and herbal/supplement side effects and interactions to assess for will be featured. A discussion on generic versus brand name will assist us to make decisions on which drugs to use and what you need to know about substitutes.

NOVEMBER 22, 2013 - Wound Management: A Multidisciplinary Approach

The challenge of managing wounds requires more than one pair of hands and expertise. We will have an RN, PT, MD, and RD discuss and demonstrate the newest methods of managing wounds: surgical, pressure ulcers, traumatic, and some you haven't thought of. If you aren't using honey dressings, need to know more about wound vacs, or want to understand the chemistry of nutrition and wound healing, this program is for you.

DECEMBER 13, 2013 - Integrative Medicine: Meditation for Health and Healing

The mind-body connection will be explored with a presentation which will explain the health benefits of meditation and related relaxation and focus techniques. We will have demonstrations and practice sessions so dress comfortably, be prepared to reduce your cortisol levels, and then help your clients to do the same.

JANUARY 24, 2014 - More Sacred Cows Out to Pasture: Evidence-Based Practice

Last year the program on evidence-based practice stimulated great discussion and was well received. By request, we are continuing the format of evidence-based practice updates. The presentations are short, information rich, and up to date with content which is practical and the new Standards of Care. Some of the topics included are prevention of deep vein thrombosis, facts and physiology of fluid replacement, accurate measurement of blood pressure, and patient positioning for better outcomes.

FEBRUARY 21, 2014 - Pediatric Diabetes Epidemic

Diabetes in children is reaching epidemic numbers. The battle to turn the tide is a difficult and multi-disciplinary one. For the purpose of prevention and management of those already diagnosed, we will explore diet, lifestyle, and medication management. Dieticians, school nurses, pediatricians, exercise experts, and community leaders will discuss what we need to do and what we are doing to change the predictions of even greater numbers of children with diabetes.

MARCH 21, 2014 - Ethical-Legal Update

The rights and responsibilities of employees and employers are being explored and challenged in the workplace and in the courts.

Can you take a nap on your lunch break? Can your employer monitor your emails on the job? Can you loose your job and your license for using social media? Do you have an ethical or legal responsibility to "blow the whistle" on bad practice and what are the repercussions?

These and other issues will be presented and discussed with attorneys and nurse experts to help us navigate the work environment.

APRIL 11, 2014 - Please Help Me with My Pain

Pain takes the joy out of living, alters lives and relationships, and costs consumers millions of dollars each year. Pain management experts will discuss the physiology of acute and chronic pain and the management. Sickle cell, post-surgery, cancer, and chronic back pain are featured with a multidisciplinary approach to help the patient in pain.

Registration begins at 7:45 am. Program time is 8:15 am until 3:00 pm unless otherwise noted.


