

PHARMACOLOGY UPDATE (RN and APRN Rx approved)

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program is designed for registered nurses and advance practice registered nurses (APRN's) working in various practice settings.

LEARNING OUTCOME

To increase the participants' knowledge base regarding the most current, evidence-based pharmacological management of common medical conditions.

1. Describe the impact of lipid disorders and discuss treatment goals.

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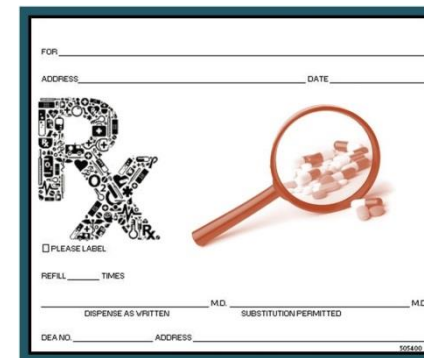
