TARGET AUDIENCE

This educational activity is designed for registered nurses and other healthcare providers who deliver patient care in the long-term, post-acute setting (home health, LTACs, rehabs, nursing homes, hospice facilities).

- Describe methods to maximize the efficacy of positive pressure devices (CPAP, BiPAP) for patients with chronic respiratory disease.
- 6. Discuss best practices in tracheostomy care, cuff management, and airway management.
- Explain the relationship between hospital readmission rates and the patient experiencing chronic respiratory disease and/or failure.
- Review best practices in wound prevention, assessment, and healing to improve patient outcomes in the home and long-term, post-acute setting.
- Describe strategies to achieve and maintain quality care and performance improvement in the long-term, postacute setting.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Long term, post-acute care hospitals and facilities (LTACs, rehabs, home health, nursing homes, hospice facilities, etc.) specialize in the treatment of patients with chronic medical conditions that necessitate care on an ongoing basis but no longer require inpatient care. Once these patients leave inpatient units, their health goals change and long-term care nurses must focus on their medical needs as well as gaining independence, comfort, rehabilitation, end of life needs, and family needs. Expert presenters at this program will address these topics and more related to caring for patients in long term, post-acute settings and the challenges of navigating through the many facilities that encompass this area of patient care.

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
