NOVEMBER 18, 2016 - Pharmacology Update (APRN Rx Approved)

Experts at this program will address this topic as well as outline the elements of a comprehensive pain assessment, discuss standards for pain management, describe pharmacologic and nonpharmacological interventions, and delve into the hot topic of opioid misuse and abuse.

FEBRUARY 17, 2017- Exploring and Understanding Alternative and Integrative Healthcare Therapies

Holistic healthcare, a form of healing which considers the whole person, requires going beyond conventional medical practices of prescription medications and procedures and incorporating alternative and integrative therapies into a patient's plan of care. Many of these "non-traditional" treatment methods are researched and evidence-based and offer safe treatment alternatives with little fear of major side effects. Join us as we learn how our patients can benefit from a wide-variety of integrative therapies.

MARCH 24, 2017 - Neuroscience Nursing

Neuroscience Nursing is a difficult specialty to master due to the vast complexities of the brain and nervous system. Nurses who practice in this field must have a firm grasp on the interworking of the nervous system and how it affects the entire body. Topics such as strokes, head and spinal traumas, Parkinson's disease, epilepsy, Alzheimer's disease, and multiple sclerosis will be presented. If you care for patients or family members suffering from a neurological injury or disease, this program is a must attend.

APRIL 28, 2017- Nursing Care of the Pediatric Special Needs Patient
